First Presbyterian Academy is pleased to announce the opening of a Middle School (grades 6-8) for the 2015-16 school year.

When will the middle school open?

The First Presbyterian Academy (FPA) Middle School will open in the fall of 2015.

Which grades will open in the fall of 2015?

The FPA Middle School will open grades 6-8.

Where will FPA Middle School be housed?

The FPA Middle School will be housed at First Presbyterian Academy. Academic classes will be held on the second floor of the Symmes-Wilson Building and the second floor of the red brick building.

How long is the academic day?

The academic day will begin at 8:00 and conclude at 3:00. Some of the extracurricular activities and sporting events will be held after school.

What academic coursework will be offered?

The academic offerings will include English, Mathematics, Social Studies, Science, Bible, and Language. The Christian World View is the framework through which the academic program is taught, and it permeates all levels of the school and all coursework at the school. The Christian World View is an overarching view of the world based on God's revealed truth, the Bible, which directs our life in the world.

Will students have the opportunity to take advanced placement coursework?

Algebra, English 1 Honors, and Physical Science will be offered for high school credit. The course catalog also includes Pre-Algebra, STEM Lab, Spanish, Latin, New Testament Survey, Old Testament Survey, and Bible Doctrines.

Will service opportunities be provided?

Yes, students will be involved in local service projects throughout the year. Also, mission trips will be offered during the academic year and during the summer.

What special programs will be offered at FPA Middle School?

The FPA Middle School will be offering Lego League, STEM Instruction, Foreign Language Instruction, Golf, Swimming, Triathlon, Tennis, Drama, Instrumental Music, and much, much more.

Will students be required to wear uniforms?

Yes, middle school students will be required to wear uniforms.

How will the students be grouped?

Students will be grouped by grade level and courses for the academic portion of the day. For the related arts curriculum, students will select the courses, and classes will be in multi age groups.

Is there a new facility in the near future?

Yes, there is a plan for a new facility that will include preschool, elementary, and the middle school. The school will be located in downtown Greenville on the FPC campus.
